

Sermon Title: The Bible's First Sermon

- 1. The Bible's opening lines declare a world view most in the world don't want to view!
- 2. Genesis' opening lines declare we're not alone and we're not in charge!
- 3. You can't live an abundant life out of <u>Eden</u> until you understand what it means to be out of <u>Eden!</u>
- 4. A life that doesn't recognize the reality of God is one of constant <u>effort</u> but continuing <u>frustration</u>.
- 5. The knowledge of God's existence and sovereignty is the starting point of hope!
- 6. If a God who <u>predates</u> the world <u>made</u> both us and the world there is hope for the world and for us.
- 7. We won't <u>hope</u> for better until we have a better understanding of God, and we won't <u>begin</u> the journey out of our limitations until we know an <u>unlimited</u> God is with us.
- Genesis isn't first and foremost a scientific rebuttal to those who prefer to embrace <u>unbelief</u>;
 it's a message of hope to those who desire to escape <u>despair</u>.
- 9. Scripture's first sermon presented a God of power to a people who felt powerless.
- 10. <u>Man</u>-centered arrogance will always seek to discredit a <u>God</u>-centered revelation.
- 11. When hope has come to an end there is a God who specializes in creative beginnings.
