MY APPLICATION

Use the following questions this week to reflect on what it would mean to align yourself with the truths taught in Scripture. Each question is meant for both personal reflection and as a catalyst for discussion with your family, friends, or small group.

- 1. Describe a perfect storm from your past. How does it compare to your experience of these times of lockdown and threats coming from Covid-19? What have you personally struggled with the most?
- 2. Read the story of Jesus calming the sea in Mark 4:35-41. What stands out to you most in the story? What is God saying to you personally as you consider this story?
- 3. Have you ever been in a situation where you doubted God's care and concern because you felt alone in your fear or pain? Were there any verses or promises of God that gave you comfort and hope during that time? What did you learn in that situation?
- 4. What is God showing you right now during this pandemic? Is there anything that you have discovered that needs to change from your prior schedule or attitude? How is your passion and dedication to Jesus growing through this perfect storm? Read Hebrews 12:28-29.
