MY APPLICATION

Use the following questions this week to reflect on what it would mean to align yourself with the truths taught in Scripture. Each question is meant for both personal reflection and as a catalyst for discussion with your family, friends, or small group.

2. Being honest, do you tend to think of a good marriage as mostly chemistry or commitment? Based on these verses (1 John 4:7-12, Song of Solomon 8:6-7, and 1 Corinthians 13:4-8a), how would you define the word love? How does making a commitment to love someone help the person making the commitment as much as it helps the one to whom the commitment is made?
3. According to the Bible, what do children need from their parents? (Deuteronomy 6:4-9, Proverbs 22:6, Proverbs 29:17, Ephesians 6:4) According to the culture, what do children need from their parents? Do you think Satan is using the expectation from the culture to distract parents from what children need the most?
4. If someone told you they don't require their children to participate in church and other spiritual growth activities because they don't want their kids to reject God in the future, how would you respond? Why?
