## **Application and Possible Questions:**

- In an evil world, walk with God.
  - How does the description of society in Noah's day (Genesis 6:1-5; 11-12).
    compare to our world today? Where do you see the influence of Satan?
- The evidence of our faith in God is obedience to His Word.
  - o Noah was a standout in his culture because he walked with God. What does it look like to walk with God today? See 2 Peter 3:7-13.
  - o Think of ways to encourage each other in pursuing a genuine walk with God.
- In the turmoil of the coming judgment, cling to God's promises.
  - Genesis 8:1 is comforting to us as we experience hardships of to follow Jesus in a sinful world. Share a time when you were in the storm and how God remembered you.
- After judgment, worship and rebuild.
  - o Read Genesis 8:21-22; Hebrews 12:28; Revelation 21:1-5 and 22:1-7. How do these promises help you to keep up your courage in the face of a coming judgment?
