Text: Genesis 9

What do you do when you see the brokenness of the World around? And even the brokenness in your own life and relationships? We can trust God to pave a different and better way for us when we walk with Him, trusting His guidance and direction.

Sermon Outline:

Big idea: New life is offered through our promise-keeping God.

- 1. God deeply values life.
- 2. God deeply values trust.

Possible Application Questions:

- What evidence do you see of brokenness of the world around you?
- After the flood, God made life-affirming promises to Noah. Why might it be difficult to trust God to keep His promises? (For Noah, and for you.)
- God designed the family to be characterized by relationships of love, respect, and honor. Why is it often difficult to keep these central relationships healthy?
 What is a way you could help make your home and family stronger?
- COVID has been a storm in our lives that we will emerge from someday soon. How do you want your life to look in this new beginning?
 - Ask God for one tangible way for you to emerge worshiping and serving
 - Ask God for one tangible way to mend strained or broken relationships in your family.
