**Text:** Matthew 10

**Discussion Questions:** *The following are based on the "My Application" Questions found in the bulletin this week. Leader urge your group members to attend worship—or watch the sermon online—and to spend time considering and answering those questions before coming to the group. This will produce a richer discussion time.*

- Describe a time in your life when you were invited to participate in something that you perceived to be really big. How did it impact your life?
- Read Matthew 10 as a group. What is most challenging to you about what Jesus asks His disciples to do?
- As disciples of Jesus, how can we take what He said to His disciples and make it relevant to our lives today?
- How have you experienced adversity for following Jesus? If you haven't, why do you think that is?
- What would happen or change for us if we really lived out Jesus' message and mission?

**Prayer Time:**

- Ask the group if there is any point of application (above) that they need God's help and power to address.
