#### Discussion Questions

- 1. Go around the group and introduce yourselves. Share about who you are, your life stage, and something fun or surprising about yourself.

## Planting Truth & Uprooting Lies

Read 2 John 1-6. The apostle John wrote the book of 2<sup>nd</sup> John (as well as 1<sup>st</sup> & 3<sup>rd</sup> John, the gospel of John and Revelation). The book is addressed to "the chosen lady and her children." There are no specific names given, so scholars have concluded that it was written to a church.

Jot down notes on the passage, specifically words or ideas that are repeated in the passage.

#### Questions to consider:

- 1. Why would John say he loves them (the recipients of the letter) in the truth?
- 2. What does John say brings him joy (v. 4)?
- 3. What do you think it looks like to be children walking in the truth?
- 4. What does John say is the command they've had from the beginning (v. 5)?
- 5. How does John define love (v. 6)?
- 6. Consider the 3 steps to demolishing lies given in lecture:
  - a. Identify the problem.
  - b. Investigate the problem and identify the lie.
  - c. Replace the lie with truth.

Spend some time considering and praying for God to show you any areas where you may be believing lie. What lie(s) are you believing or embracing? What truth do you need to embrace?
