- 5. We were encouraged not to think more highly of ourselves, or less of ourselves, but to simply think of ourselves less--Timothy Keller calls this the freedom of self-forgetfulness. Have you ever experienced this? Share with the group?
- 6. Look at the "God's truth about me" list. Which of these did you need to hear or be reminded of today? Is one truth difficult for you to completely embrace?
- 7. Have you ever considered that God's verdict of you has little to do with you and everything to do with Jesus? How does this motivate, encourage, or free you?

## Planting Truth & Uprooting Lies

In the first part of Chapter 8, Paul says there is no condemnation for those who believe in Jesus--not because we are innocent, but because Jesus, who was innocent, took our place. Read Romans 8:31-39.

Jot down notes on the passage, specifically words or ideas that are repeated in the passage.

#### Questions to consider:

- 1. What is the rhetorical question Paul asks in verse 31? What is the obvious answer? (v.31)
- 2. Paul says no one can bring a charge against us that will stand because there is only one person who justifies us. Who is that one person? (v. 33)
- 3. Where is Jesus currently and what is he doing? (v.34)
- 4. How does Paul answer the question, "Who shall separate us from the love of Christ?" (v.35-39)
- 5. What truth do these verses tell you about God? What do they tell you about yourself?
- 6. Is there a lie you believe about yourself that needs to be replaced with truth? Take time to identify the lie and write out the truth. (Pray and even call a friend to help you process if needed.)
- 7. Take a few minutes and think of yourself less. Really. Set a timer for a couple minutes and focus on God. Read this scripture again or listen to praise music if that is helpful. Enjoy the freedom of self-forgetfulness when you focus on the beauty of our Lord and his generous grace with which he has lavished upon us.
