What has that looked like in your life?
4. Where and when in your life have you experienced darkness and gloom like the nation of Israel did? Have you ever asked for a sign from God? What brought you hope during that time?
5. Take time as a group to read Isaiah 9:1-7. Based off of what Isaiah says, what hope do we have in the middle of darkness and gloom?
6. What barriers do you have to experience this hope in your life? What steps can you take this week to take God at His Word and act accordingly?
