Isaiah 13-14

- 1. The context for pride (Isaiah 13)
 - Have you ever been a me <u>monster</u>?
- 2. The God who opposes the proud (Isaiah 14)
 - God opposes the <u>proud</u>.
- 3. The mirror of pride
 - Pride desires <u>attention</u>.
 - Pride says, "I would <u>never</u> do that."
 - Pride celebrates self-sufficiency .
 - Pride puts <u>you</u> first rather than others.
 - Pride puts you in front of <u>God</u>.
- 4. The killing of pride
 - Kill pride before it kills <u>you</u>.

- 6. What is one way this week Jesus could become greater in your life and you could become less?
