MY APPLICATION

Use the following questions this week to reflect on what it would mean to align yourself with the truths taught in Scripture. Each question is meant for both personal reflection and as a catalyst for discussion with your family, friends, or small group.

- 2. What does God tell the people in Isaiah 40:1-2; 10-11 to let them know He cares? Have you ever had a hard time accepting this? What were the circumstances?
- 3. Look at God's description of Himself in Isaiah 40:12-28. What grabs your imagination the most?
- 4. What does it mean to "wait on the Lord?" What is God's promise when you do? Read Isaiah 40:29-31. Describe a time when you have experienced His strength in waiting.
