- 2. Which of the verses in the above passage are most meaningful to you and why?
- 3. In Isaiah 53:6, God describes us as sheep who wander away from their shepherd. What are some areas of your life where you tend to wander from God's will for your life?
- 4. Think about what Jesus experienced to provide you forgiveness and a new life. How does His suffering motivate you to live for Him? What areas of your life do you need to surrender to Him?
