

Bad Sermon?

Matthew 13

1.	There is nothing wrong with the <u>Good News</u> (seed).
	The problem is with the listener's <u>heart</u> (soil).

2. The followers of Jesus will live <u>together</u> with those who reject Him until the <u>end</u> of this age. Then they will be <u>separated</u> to destruction and to glory.

3. When you discover the <u>value</u> of God's kingdom, you will give <u>everything</u> you have to <u>acquire</u> it.

MY APPLICATION

Use the following questions this week to reflect on what it would mean to align yourself with the truths taught in Scripture. Each question is meant for both personal reflection and as a catalyst for discussion with your family, friends, or small group.

- 1. Describe the worst sermon you ever heard. What made it so bad? Why would the disciples question Jesus about preaching in parables? (See Matthew 13:10)
- 2. Have you ever been rejected when sharing the Gospel? Describe that experience. How does Jesus' teaching on the farmer sowing seed help us with this rejection?
- 3. Read Matthew 13:24-30, 37-43, and 47-51. What is the meaning of these two parables? What is the Holy Spirit saying to you right now?
- 4. How much do you value being part of the kingdom of heaven? Read Matthew 13:44-45. Does it fill you with joy enough to sacrifice <u>all</u> to follow Jesus? Explain your thoughts.
