- 1. When you think of our national and local leaders, what are the top three words that come to mind? (Try to avoid a discussion of political positions and personal criticisms and think more generally.) Do you feel humans have a deep desire to be led by someone? Explain your answer.
- 2. Read Deuteronomy 17:14-17. Compare these commands to the reign of Solomon in 1 Kings 10:14-11:6. Solomon fell for the distractions of power, status and wealth. What are some common distractions believers fall for today?
- 3. Read Deuteronomy 17:18-20. Why is the king commanded to have his own, personal copy of the Deuteronomy to keep with him all the days of his life? Do you feel it is possible to maintain an undivided focus on God without daily time in the Bible and prayer? Explain your answer.
- 4. What area are you called to lead right now? It doesn't have to be a formal leadership position. What are some growth areas that would improve your ability to be a godly example to those you lead?
