MY APPLICATION

Use the following questions this week to reflect on what it would mean to align yourself with the truths taught in Scripture. Each question is meant for both personal reflection and as a catalyst for discussion with your family, friends, or small group.

- 3. Make a list of all the reasons Joseph had to take revenge on his brothers. What changed his heart from bitterness to forgiveness? (See Genesis 45:4-8) Pondering the promise of Romans 8:28, what is the most important vantage point to process the sins others have committed against us?
- 4. Joseph said "God sent me ahead of you to...save your lives by a great deliverance." What is the greatest deliverance that God has performed to save us? (See Romans 5:8; John 3:16; Romans 4:25-5:1-3) Have you repented of your sin, accepted the gift of forgiveness, and become reconciled to God? Share your story with the group.
