These series of classes are designed to share these Signs of New Life with you and discuss them to give you a better sense of who New Life Church is as a community of believers.

INTRODUCTION OF CLASSES

The Discover New Life Classes are designed to help you become *a fully matured follower of Jesus Christ*. These classes are made up of three components that equip new members to 1) connect with the mission and core values of New Life, 2) discover the spiritual impact growth that communities can have on their spiritual development, and 3) learn how to use their God-given gifts to make a difference in the lives of others within and outside of the church family.

Each class helps you take a step closer to realizing God's plan for your life and ultimately, connecting with other people and communities within our church where you can grow in your walk with Christ together.

CLASS ONE: FOLLOW CHRIST (First Sunday of every month)

The Goal of this Class:

To become better acquainted with our story, the mission, values and beliefs of New Life Church. To connect with others who are interested in plugging into New Life and have the opportunity to become a church member.

CLASS TWO: GROW IN COMMUNITY (Second Sunday of every month)

The Goal of this Class:

To discover how much we value seeing the Church as a Community of believers growing together and serving together. We will learn what it means to grow spiritually and how that is done at New Life. This class will explore why relational growth communities are critical to our growth as a Christian.

CLASS THREE: LOVE OTHERS (Third Sunday of every month)

The Goal of this Class:

To discover and understand how our personal and spiritual makeup reveals the path to our purpose. In this class, we will learn where we fit in service to others. We will also discover our Spiritual Gifts, and the serving and discipleship communities that we may utilize them in.

CLASS TWO: GROW IN COMMUNITY

PART ONE:

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PART ONE: UNDERSTANDING RELATIONAL COMMUNITIES

THE GOAL OF THIS CLASS:

The goal of this class is to help our members understand the biblical foundations of discipleship. It covers the biblical call to include other believers in our walk with God. It also provides opportunities to get plugged in to a Life Group, Discipleship Class or a Serving Community (ministry) at New Life where people experience growth through authentic, godly relationships.

Through this class we hope to discover how highly New Life values seeing the church as a community of believers growing and serving together. We will learn what it means to grow spiritually, as well as, how that is done at New Life. This class will explore why relational growth communities are critical to our growth as a Christian.

I. WHAT ARE RELATIONAL "COMMUNITIES"?

New Life Church seeks to grow people by connecting them to each other, and to Christ through discipleship systems that we call "*Relational Communities*".

'Relational Communities' are discipleship environments where spiritual growth takes place in small groups of believers studying of the Word of God, praying for each other, serving in ministry together, encouraging each other and building close relational connections that promote spiritual and personal growth. Throughout the New Testament we see the early church coming together for prayer, fellowship and teaching in deeply healthy and relational communities (**Acts 2:42**).

We believe that these 'relational communities' are the primary way that discipleship and ministry service was modeled for us in scripture. Repeatedly in the Bible, we are called to 'love one another', 'pray for one another', 'forgive one another', 'encourage one another'... Simply put, we can't grow and thrive in Christ without 'one another'.

II. THE BIBLICAL MODEL FOR RELATIONAL COMMUNITIES

Acts 2:42-47 (NKJV) – "⁴² And they continued steadfastly in the apostles' doctrine and fellowship, in the breaking of bread, and in prayers. ⁴³ Then fear came upon every soul, and many wonders and signs were done through the apostles. ⁴⁴ Now all who believed were together, and had all things in common, ⁴⁵ and sold their possessions and goods, and divided them among all, as anyone had need.

⁴⁶ So continuing daily with one accord in the temple, and breaking bread from house to house, they ate their food with gladness and simplicity of heart, ⁴⁷ praising God and having favor with all the people. And the Lord added to the church daily those who were being saved."

III. FOUR KEY COMPONENTS OF RELATIONAL COMMUNITIES:

- 4. New Life has Two types of "Discipleship Communities" Both of these communities embody each of the four key components of 'Relational Communities' (see Part 1, section IV)
 - A. Discipleship Community #1: SMALL GROUPS (Also known as "Life Groups")
 - a. How Small Groups work at New Life:
 - i. Small Groups are designed to shrink the size of the congregation and ignite genuine fellowship with a group of like-minded believers.
 - ii. Through Small Groups, members develop a deeper intimacy with God, experience real community and increase their influence and witness with unbelievers.

- iii. Each group is based on a varying range of criteria, such as: age, gender, marital status, etc.
- iv. Each group determines their own meeting frequency and location.
- v. Participation in these groups can be long-term or short-term, depending on what is most comfortable for each participant.

b. There are three categories of Small Groups at New Life Church

- Life Groups <u>Life Groups</u> are Bible study groups that vary in interest, topics, age and marital status. These groups meet in homes throughout the city and are great ways to establish long-term discipling relationships.
- ii. New Believer's Small Group The <u>New Believer's Small Group</u> is a group Bible study specifically designed to aid new believers in understanding the truth of the Gospel, and how to successfully start their new walk with Jesus Christ.
- iii. Starting Point Small Group <u>Starting Point Small Group</u> is a group discussion that is designed to be a safe place for individuals to ask hard questions about faith, God and His plan for life. We don't profess to have all the answers, but we are committed to pointing people to the One who does.

Regardless of your age, interest or location, we are sure that there is a group for you. If you would like to join one of our small groups, simply <u>visit our website</u> and <u>check out our online directory of groups</u>, or <u>visit the</u> <u>Information Center</u> at the New Life campus. We would love for you to get connected!

B. Discipleship Community #2: DISCIPLESHIP CLASSES (Also known as "New Life Bible Institute" - NLBI)

- a. These classes cover a variety of Biblical topics and are offered throughout the week.
- b. The make-up of these discipleship classes will vary dependent on the topics that each class will cover.
- c. Our discipleship class sizes are kept small to encourage intimate relational environments, but unlike Life Groups, they are conducted on the New Life Church campus.
- d. Participation in these classes is short term. A typical class topic normally ranges from 6 to 8 weeks in duration.
- e. Each discipleship class has the goal of teaching the Word of God in an easy-to-understand, practical way. You will not only establish great relationships and grow in your walk with God, you will also see the Bible in a whole new light and learn how it intersects with your everyday life and experiences.

5. Let's look at what it means to be a part of a "Discipleship Community" at New Life.

New Life's discipleship communities are a group of people at varying levels of spiritual development, gathered together around the study of the scriptures for the purpose of applying its truths to their everyday lives.

A. Each Discipleship Community at New Life focuses on 3 things:

a. Our Relationship with _____.

There is no higher goal of discipleship than for each disciple to develop a strong and healthy relationship with God. This is the main focus of discipleship communities at New Life. Our aim is for you to know God more intimately, love Him more deeply and serve Him more passionately than you ever have before.

b. Our Relationship with each _____.

Nothing is more evident in discipleship than the truth that we need each other. Being in a discipleship community allows us to both encourage others with our story, and then to be encouraged by others with their story. Everyone in our discipleship communities each bring with them unique contributions of wisdom, insight, encouragement, hope and support. Our discipleship communities allow for every person to have a hand in every other person's growth.

c. Our Relationship with the _____ around us.

We all live in different worlds. We all have different families, careers, jobs, friends, causes we believe in, etc. All of these things make up our immediate world around us. Then there is the larger world that connects all of us. In that world we wrestle with the social and political issues of our day, the challenges of the larger culture around us, as well as, the concerns of people we may never meet on the other side of our globe. We are called to relate to, and view the world we live in through the lens of Scripture, and carry the light of the truth of God to those with whom we are engaged. Discipleship communities equip us to hold up our light, even in a dark world.

B. How do I get connected in a Discipleship Community at New Life?

a. Find a Small Group (Life Group) and/or a Discipleship Class

- ii. Stop by the Information Desk in the Church Lobby to ask for more information.
- iii. Contact your *Connect Team* representative from the Discover New Life Ministry.
- iv. Attend Small Group Leader training and start your own Life Group.
- v. Contact the Church Office for more information.

b. Commit to a Life Group and/or a Discipleship Class for a season

Group meetings and classes are always happening throughout the year, and new groups start at regular intervals throughout the calendar year. Most of our small groups are open to new members, and all New Life Church's discipleship classes are open to new members through the class semester.

c. Experience life-change

You'll never fully experience all that New Life Church has to offer until you get connected in a Life Group or plugged into a Discipleship Class! Discipleship communities were vital to the early church's growth, and they are just as vital now.

HABIT #1: REGULAR STUDY OF THE WORD OF GOD

1. GETTING A GRASP ON GOD'S WORD

2 Timothy 3:16-17 – "All Scripture is given by inspiration of God, and is profitable for doctrine, for reproof, for correction, for instruction in righteousness, that the man of God may be complete, thoroughly equipped for every good work."

2. HOW TO FULLY BENEFIT FROM MY TIME IN THE WORD OF GOD

A. WE MUST ______ ITS AUTHORITY.

We believe that the Holy Bible, and only the Bible, is the authoritative Word of God. It alone is the final authority in determining all doctrinal truths. In its original writing, it is inspired, infallible and inerrant.

1 Thessalonians 2:13 – "we also thank God continually because, when you received the word of God, which you heard from us, you accepted it not as the word of men, but as it actually is, the word of God, which is at work in you who believe."

We believe in the "closed canon" of Scripture:

There are not – nor will there ever be – any other books, writings or ideas added to the Bible or placed beside it as equal in authority or revelation.

All preaching, teaching, counsel or any other communication being declared in the name of Christ, or His church, are to be subject to the precepts and principles written in the Word of God.

HABIT #4: GENEROUSLY SERVING OTHERS

Mark 10:43-45 – "...whoever desires to become great among you shall be your servant. And whoever of you desires to be first shall be servant of all. For even the Son of Man did not come to be served, but to serve, and to give His life a ransom for many."

Galatians 5:13-14 – "... do not use liberty as an opportunity for the flesh, but through love serve one another. For all the law is fulfilled in one word, even in this: You shall love your neighbor as yourself."

1. The bottom line is that followers of Jesus Christ ______ others.

We are called to daily give of ourselves in service to others. Jesus taught us that true greatness is found in coming alongside others and lifting them up; it is found in loving and serving one another. Jesus himself demonstrated in that He spent His life serving others, rather than seeking others to serve Him.
